Memorandum of Understanding

Australasian Institute of Ayurvedic studies, New Zealand and Babe Ke Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, V.P.O-Daudhar, Distt-Moga, Punjab, India enters this Memorandum of Agreement for the purpose of establishing a formal relationship between the two institutions.

The aims of the Memorandum of agreement are:

- That two institutions link together for educational co-operation.
- That the two institutions agree to develop programmes of co-operation in vocational areas of mutual interest and benefits.
- That they will encourage joint project development
- That they will share experience in the use of ICT for blended learning.
- That they will explore opportunities for staff exchanges and for professional development.
- That both institutions will facilitate student mobility transnationally.
- That they will share best practice in institutional management, and especially in matters of continuous quality improvement.
- That they will organise joint workshops, seminar, conferences and Cultural Programme.
- That from either side same agreement shall not be signed in Punjab (INDIA).


This agreement may be amended in the future, in the light of the developing relationship between the two institutions, and such amendments may be made by the agreement of the senior managers of both institutions. The operation of this Memorandum of Understanding will be set out in associated Terms of Agreement.

This agreement shall be in place, initially, for a period of three years, commencing on the date of signing, but may be terminated by either party with six months notice. Where existing commitments in respect of staff or students or joint projects are in place they will be honoured, upon the completion of notice period.

The agreement involves no change in the independence of either institution, and has no implications for other constitutional arrangements.

Terms of Agreement

These terms of Agreement define the operational arrangement between Australasian Institute of Ayurvedic studies, New Zealand and Babe Ke Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, V.P.O-Daudhar, Distt-Moga, Punjab, India. Between whom a memorandum of Agreement has been signed.

1. In developing the Memorandum of Agreement, it is now agreed that there will be a guaranteed progression scheme put in place between the two institutions, based on entry criteria which have been mutually approved Babe Ke Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, V.P.O-Daudhar, Distt-Moga, Punjab, India. agrees to prove AIAS, New Zealand with evidence of applicant's entry qualifications, if required, Babe Ke Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, V.P.O-Daudhar, Distt-Moga, Punjab, India. agrees to provide Information With annual updates on course developments and opportunities to study in AIAS, New Zealand.

The following guaranteed places and confirmed:

2. The Babe Ke Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, V.P.O-Daudhar, Distt-Moga, Punjab, India. college will share the content of its curriculum and advise on assessment and examination arrangements, in order to provide as a basis on which student entry levels to AIAS programme may be determined.
3. The two institutions agree to contribute to monitor courses in order to seek additional opportunities for student progression.
4. AIAS will offer access to publicity and promotional materials, including links to its website to assist in the local marketing of opportunities.
5. AIAS will provide, as early as possible in the preceding academic year, advice on its international fee structure, including local arrangements with the consent and mutual Agreement between both the parties.
6. Both institutions agree to work with 'Go Study Abroad' which has bases in both Chandigarh and Glasgow, to assist in the development of joint opportunities and to assist in marketing and students support.
7. This agreement does not limit the number of applications, as all students may apply for places on the basis of merit. However, it does recognise the value and importance of each institution of a guaranteed places scheme.
